SUBJECT: Evaluation of the Demilitarization of Damaged, Destroyed, and Expended Defense Articles Requiring Enhanced End-Use Monitoring in Ukraine
(Project No. D2025-DEV0PC-0039.000)

The purpose of this memorandum is to notify you that we are initiating the subject evaluation.

The objective of this evaluation is to assess the effectiveness with which DoD Components demilitarized damaged, destroyed, and expended defense articles transferred to Ukraine that require enhanced end-use monitoring (EEUM). We may revise the objective as the evaluation proceeds, and we will also consider suggestions from management for additional or revised objectives. We plan to perform this evaluation in accordance with the Council of the Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency "Quality Standards for Inspection and Evaluation."

We will perform the evaluation at demilitarization sites in the U.S. European Command area of responsibility, including the Remote Maintenance and Distribution Center-Ukraine and logistics locations in Ukraine. We may identify additional organizations and locations during the evaluation.

We request that you designate two points of contact for this evaluation within 5 days of this memorandum. One point of contact should be a Government employee—a GS-15, pay band equivalent, or military equivalent—who is knowledgeable about the demilitarization of EEUM-designated defense articles provided to Ukraine. The second point of contact should be a member of the Senior Executive Service or a General/Flag Officer who is familiar with the demilitarization of EEUM-designated defense articles in Ukraine and could serve as a point of engagement with DoD Office of Inspector General senior leaders, if necessary. 
