SUBJECT: Evaluation of the Impact Protecting DoD High Risk Personnel on the Military  
Criminal Investigative Organizations. (Project No. D2025-DEV0SV-0037.000)

The purpose of this memorandum is to notify you that we are initiating the subject evaluation.

The objective of this evaluation is to assess the extent to which the Military Criminal Investigative Organizations (MCIOs) efforts to perform high-risk personnel protection missions affects their ability to perform other missions. The MCIOs include the Department of Army Criminal Investigation Division (DACID), Naval Criminal Investigative Service (NCIS), and the Air Force Office of Special Investigations (AFOSI). We may revise the objective as the evaluation proceeds, and we will consider suggestions from management for additional or revised objectives.


We will perform this evaluation at various DACID, NCIS, and AFOSI locations. We may identify additional locations during the evaluation. We plan to perform this evaluation in accordance with the Council of the Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency "Quality Standards for Inspection and Evaluation."

We request that you designate two points of contact for this evaluation within **5 working days** of this memorandum. One point of contact should be a government employee—a GS-15, pay band equivalent, or military equivalent—who has knowledge of the MCIOs' high-risk personnel protection mission. The second point of contact should be a member of the Senior Executive Service or a General/Flag Officer who is familiar with the MCIOs' protection mission and could serve as a point of engagement with DoD Office of Inspector General senior leaders, if necessary.
