



Jamie C. Frederick, Captain USCG
Commander, U.S. Coast Guard Sector Boston



Captain Frederick arrives at Sector Boston after serving as the Enforcement Branch Chief at the First Coast Guard District, where he provided oversight of maritime law enforcement, security operations, and cutter management across the Northeast. Additionally, he served as Search and Rescue Mission Coordinator and Active Search Suspension Authority, including overseeing search efforts for the TITAN submersible that went missing near the Titanic site in 2023.

Captain Frederick has 30 years of Coast Guard service at units along the Atlantic and Pacific coasts, and the Great Lakes. During his enlisted time, he advanced to Machinery Technician Second Class and served aboard USCGC BITTERSWEET and Station Two Rivers before he was selected to attend Officer Candidate School.



Captain Frederick's operational assignments include Group Key West and Station Cape Disappointment where he commanded the largest motor lifeboat station in the Coast Guard that included the treacherous Columbia River Bar, nicknamed the "Graveyard of the Pacific." He also served as Chief of Enforcement and Chief of Response at Sector Northern New England.

Captain Frederick's staff assignments include Aide to the Coast Guard Chief of Staff and Congressional Liaison Officer to the U.S. House of Representatives where he worked directly with the Coast Guard's appropriations and authorizing committees to ensure the Service received the necessary resources and legislative authorities. He also served as the Chief of Public Affairs for the Coast Guard's Atlantic Area and Executive Assistant to the First District Commander.

A native of New York State, Captain Frederick holds a Bachelor of Science from Troy University and a Master of Arts from the Johns Hopkins University. His awards include six Coast Guard Meritorious Service Medals, three Coast Guard Commendation Medals, the Coast Guard Achievement Medal, and numerous unit and service awards. He has also been designated an Honorary Chief Petty Officer.

Together, he and his wife Kimberly have four children and one granddaughter – Alexandra, Aiden, Nathaniel, Maxton and Josephine. Aiden is currently serving in the Coast Guard, and Nathaniel will be attending the Coast Guard Academy Scholars Program this academic year.
