SUBJECT: Follow-up Evaluation of Management Advisory: The Protection of Sensitive Mission Data by the Security Assistance Group-Ukraine and Its Subordinate Commands (Report No. DODIG-2024-002) (Project No. D2024-DEV0PE-0083.000)

The purpose of this memorandum is to notify you that we plan to begin the subject evaluation in February 2024. The objective of this follow-up evaluation of “Management Advisory: The Protection of Sensitive Mission Data by the Security Assistance Group-Ukraine and Its Subordinate Commands” (Report No. DODIG-2024-002) is to assess the extent to which the Security Assistance Group–Ukraine and its subordinate commands, in coordination with the U.S. Army Europe and Africa, have fully implemented plans and issued guidance to improve compliance with DoD information security policies. We may revise the objective as the evaluation proceeds, and we will also consider suggestions from management for additional or revised objectives. We plan to perform this evaluation in accordance with Council of the Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency “Quality Standards for Inspection and Evaluation.”

We will perform the evaluation at site located in Poland and Germany. We may identify additional locations during the evaluation.

We request that you designate a staff member to serve as our point of contact for this evaluation within **5 days** of this memorandum. The point of contact should be a Government employee—a GS-15, pay band equivalent, or military equivalent—and knowledgeable of enhanced end-use monitoring inventory procedures. Send the contact’s name, title, grade/pay band, phone number, and email address to [REDACTED]
