NAZI SEAMAN BURIED UNDER THE AMERICAN FLAG

A GERMAN SAILOR IS BURIED AT SEA, UNDER THE AMERICAN FLAG AND WITH SERVICES READ BY A COAST GUARD OFFICER, FROM THE DECK OF A COAST GUARD-MANNED DESTROYER ESCORT—ONE OF THREE DE'S WHICH BLASTED HIS U-BOAT TO THE BOTTOM IN BATTLE AFTER THE U-BOAT HAD TORPEDOED AN AMERICAN TANKER. THE COMMANDING OFFICER OF THE NAZI SUB, ONE OF 12 SURVIVORS PICKED UP BY THE COAST GUARDSMEN, AUTHORIZED USE OF THE AMERICAN FLAG FOR THE BURIAL WHEN NO GERMAN FLAG WAS AVAILABLE. ANOTHER COAST GUARD-MANNED DE AND ONE MANNED BY U.S. NAVY SEAMEN HELPED SINK THE NAZI RAIDER IN THE BATTLE IN WHICH THE GERMAN SEAMAN WAS KILLED.
