SUBJECT: Evaluation of the Military Departments' Implementation of Prohibited Activity
Training to Prevent, Identify, and Counter Extremist Activities
(Project No. D2024-DEV0HC-0148.000)

The purpose of this memorandum is to notify you that we plan to begin the subject evaluation in July 2024. The objective of this evaluation is to determine the effectiveness of the Military Departments' efforts to develop and implement prohibited activity training to prevent, identify, and counter extremist activities. We may revise the objective as the evaluation proceeds, and we will also consider suggestions from management for additional or revised objectives. We plan to perform this evaluation in accordance with the Council of the Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency "Quality Standards for Inspection and Evaluation."

We will perform the evaluation at the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness, the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Intelligence and Security, the Military Services, and the National Guard Bureau. We may identify additional locations during the evaluation.

We request that you designate two staff members to serve as our points of contact for this evaluation within **5 days** of this memorandum. The points of contact should be Government employees—pay band or military equivalent of a member of the Senior Executive Service and a GS-15—who are knowledgeable of the Military Services' process to develop and implement prohibited activity training related to the objective. Send each contact's name, title, grade/pay band, phone number, and email address to [REDACTED]
