## MEMORANDUM FOR SECRETARY OF THE ARMY UNDER SECRETARY OF DEFENSE FOR PERSONNEL AND READINESS GENERAL COUNSEL OF THE DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE PERFORMANCE IMPROVEMENT OFFICER AND DIRECTOR OF ADMINISTRATION AND MANAGEMENT

SUBJECT: Review of Medals of Honor Awarded for Actions Related to the Engagement at Wounded Knee Creek, on December 29, 1890

I direct the Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness (USD(P&R)) to convene a Special Review Panel (SRP) which, at a minimum, will consist of five experts, two of whom will be from the Department of the Interior (DOI), to conduct a review of each Medal of Honor (MOH) awarded to an Army Soldier for actions related to the engagement at Wounded Knee Creek (WKC), South Dakota (SD), on December 29, 1890. The scope of the SRP's review is limited to reviewing each WKC MOH awardee's individual actions during this specific engagement on or about December 29, 1890, at WKC, SD. The SRP may consider the context of the overall engagement as appropriate, including as necessary to understand each WKC MOH recipient's individual actions. The USD(P&R) is hereby delegated authority to facilitate administration of the review, including tasking other DoD organizations on my behalf regarding this matter and acting as DoD's liaison with the Domestic Policy Council and DOI.

A review of the WKC MOHs is warranted based on a range of factors, including the findings reflected in the Joint Explanatory Statement accompanying the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2022, which encouraged a review of the WKC MOHs.

The SRP will report to me, through the USD(P&R). Washington Headquarters Services will provide administrative support.

The Secretary of the Army will provide, not later than July 26, 2024, the Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness (OUSD(P&R)) with historical records associated with the engagement of WKC, including, but not limited to:

- For the 20 Soldiers whose MOH citations indicate the medal was awarded for actions related to the engagement of WKC on December 29, 1890 (list attached), all documents associated with the award recommendation and final award and each Soldier's personnel file.
- Copies of any Army reports or investigations into the actions at WKC.
- Any other known historical documents salient to the engagement at WKC.

The Secretary of the Army will provide support to the SRP in the form of document retrieval, answering requests for information regarding the engagement at WKC, and otherwise providing SRP members information necessary for the conduct of the review.

The USD(P&R) will request from the DOI all historical documents and records in its possession associated with the engagement of WKC not later than July 26, 2024.

The SRP will review each WKC MOH award individually to ensure no Soldier was recognized for conduct that did not merit recognition under the standards applicable at the time. In conducting its review, the SRP will use:

- The MOH award standards and applicable laws and regulations in effect on December 29, 1890; the SRP will assess whether conduct demonstrated any disqualifying actions, such as: intentionally directing an attack against a noncombatant or an individual who has surrendered in good faith, murder or rape of a prisoner, or engaging in any other act demonstrating immorality; and
- Available historical records on the engagement of WKC and associated MOHs awarded, including U.S. Army investigations and reports, original MOH award files, official military personnel records, records of interviews of witnesses at the event, and any other relevant historical documents the SRP deems appropriate.

The SRP will provide a written report to me, through the USD(P&R) within 90 days of convening, but not later than October 15, 2024, that includes a retain or rescind recommendation for each WKC MOH awarded. Each recommendation will include a rationale. Substantiating documents, where such records are available, will be provided for all recommendations.
