SUBJECT: Evaluation of the U.S. Navy's Efforts to Prevent and Respond to Incidents of Deaths by Suicide, Suicide Attempts, and Suicidal Ideation (Project No. D2024-DEV0PB-0089.000)

The purpose of this memorandum is to notify you that we plan to begin the subject evaluation in February 2024. As directed by the James M. Inhofe National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) for Fiscal Year 2023, the objective of this evaluation is to determine whether the Department of Navy effectively took actions to prevent and respond to incidents of deaths by suicide, suicide attempts, and suicidal ideation among members of the Navy assigned to sea duty or shore duty. We may revise the objective as the evaluation proceeds, and we will also consider suggestions from management for additional or revised objectives. We plan to perform this evaluation in accordance with the Council of the Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency "Quality Standards for Inspection and Evaluation."

We will perform the evaluation at the Department of the Navy, Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Personnel and Readiness, and the Defense Health Agency in the National Capital Region. We will perform site visits to Norfolk Naval Air Station, Virginia; Naval Base San Diego, California; Naval Base Kitsap Bremerton, Washington; and Naval Station Pearl Harbor, Hawaii. We may identify additional locations during the evaluation.

We request that you designate a staff member to serve as our point of contact for this evaluation within **5 days** of this memorandum. The point of contact should be a Government employee—a GS-15, pay band equivalent, or military equivalent—and knowledgeable of the DoD and Department of Navy suicide prevention, intervention, and postvention programs and recent investigations and reports related to the objective.
