SUBJECT: Evaluation of the National Guard Bureau Office of Complex Investigations
Administrative Investigations of Reported Sexual Assaults
(Project No. D2025-DEV0SV-0031.000)

The purpose of this memorandum is to notify you that we are initiating the subject evaluation.

The objective of this evaluation is to assess the effectiveness with which the National Guard Bureau (NGB) Office of Complex Investigations (OCI) developed and executed processes and procedures to administratively investigate sexual assault allegations. We may revise the objective as the evaluation proceeds, and we will also consider suggestions from management for additional or revised objectives. We plan to perform this evaluation in accordance with the Council of the Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency “Quality Standards for Inspection and Evaluation.”

We will perform the evaluation at various locations of the NGB OCI. We may identify additional locations during the evaluation.

We request that you designate two points of contact for this evaluation within **5 days** of this memorandum. One point of contact should be a Government employee—a GS-15, pay band equivalent, or military equivalent—who is knowledgeable of NGB OCI processes. The second point of contact should be a member of the Senior Executive Service or a General/Flag Officer who is familiar with NGB OCI processes and could serve as a point of engagement with DoD Office of Inspector General senior leaders, if necessary. Send each contact’s name, title, grade/pay band, phone number, and email address to [REDACTED]
