



COLONEL BROCK E. LANGE

Col. Brock E. Lange is the Commander of the 192nd Wing, Virginia Air National Guard, at Joint Base Langley-Eustis, Virginia. He is responsible for the readiness of more than 1,400 Airmen in the execution of multiple federal and state missions to include the F-22 Raptor, intelligence (distributed common ground system), cyber operations, civil engineering (RED HORSE), security forces, and Chemical, Biological, Radiation, Nuclear and Explosive Response Force Package (CERFP).

Col. Lange was commissioned in 2002 after graduating from the University of Colorado as a distinguished graduate of the Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps program. He earned his pilot wings at Laughlin Air Force Base, Texas, and went on to fly the F-15C/D at Mountain Home AFB, Idaho. Following that assignment, he transitioned to the F-22 and has held a variety of flying assignments at the squadron and group level, including as the Chief of Standardization and Evaluation in the 1st Fighter Wing. In August 2013, Col. Lange transitioned to the Virginia Air National Guard's 149th Fighter Squadron as a Drill Status Guardsman. He served in the United States Air Force Legislative Liaison Office in the U.S. House of Representatives. He also served as the Chief of Programs for the ANG, responsible for annual programming of \$13B to organize, train, and equip the primary combat reserve of the USAF. The colonel has commanded at the squadron and group level.

In his civilian capacity, Col. Lange is a first officer with a major airline. Prior to his current position, he was the Director, Chief's Action Group, Office of the Chief, NGB, where he was responsible for strategic planning, communications, and travel coordination for the Chief of the NGB.
