SUBJECT: Audit of the DoD's Enhanced End-Use Monitoring of Defense Articles
Provided to Israel (Project No. D2025-D000RM-0008.000)

The purpose of this memorandum is to notify you that we are initiating the subject audit. The objective of this audit is to assess the effectiveness with which the DoD conducted enhanced end-use monitoring of designated defense articles provided to the State of Israel. We may revise the objective as the audit proceeds, and we will also consider suggestions from management for additional or revised objectives. We plan to perform this audit in accordance with the Government Accountability Office's generally accepted government auditing standards.

We will perform the audit at the Defense Security Cooperation Agency, the U.S. Central Command, and the Office of Defense Cooperation-Israel. We may identify additional locations during the audit.

We request that you designate two points of contact for this audit within **5 days** of this memorandum. One point of contact should be a Government employee—a GS-15, pay band equivalent, or military equivalent—who is knowledgeable of enhanced end-use monitoring of designated defense articles provided to Israel. The second point of contact should be a member of the Senior Executive Service or a General/Flag Officer who is familiar with enhanced end-use monitoring in Israel and could serve as a point of engagement with DoD Office of Inspector General senior leaders, if necessary. Send each contact's name, title, grade/pay band, phone number, and email address to audrgo@dodig.mil.
