SUBJECT: Follow-up Evaluation of Longstanding Healthcare-Related Recommendations
(Project No. D2025-DEV0HD-0101.000)

The purpose of this memorandum is to notify you that we plan to begin the subject follow-up evaluation in April 2025.

The objective of this follow-up evaluation is to assess the extent to which the DoD has taken actions to implement longstanding healthcare-related recommendations issued by the DoD Office of Inspector General. The focus of this follow-up evaluation is recommendations previously issued in reports published at least 3 years ago; however, more recent recommendations could also be included. We may revise the objective as the follow-up evaluation proceeds, and we will also consider suggestions from management for additional or revised objectives. We plan to perform this follow-up evaluation in accordance with the Council of the Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency, "Quality Standards for Inspection and Evaluation."

We will perform the follow-up evaluation primarily at locations in the National Capital Region. We may identify additional locations during the follow-up evaluation.

We request that you designate two points of contact for this follow-up evaluation within **5 days** of this memorandum. The points of contact should be Government employees—One point of contact should be a Government employee—a GS-15, pay band equivalent, or military equivalent—who is knowledgeable of the efforts the organization has taken to close longstanding healthcare-related recommendations. The second point of contact should be a member of the Senior Executive Service or a General/Flag Officer who is familiar with the longstanding healthcare-related recommendations and could serve as a point of engagement with DoD Office of Inspector General senior leaders, if necessary. Send each contact's name, title, grade/pay band, phone number, and email address to [REDACTED]
