DSCA is a global team of more than 1,300 personnel. Consistent with Title 10, Sections 382 and 384, DSCA is organized to improve the effectiveness and efficiency of the Security Cooperation (SC) enterprise's business operations and integrates efforts across U.S.C. Title 10 and Title 22 authorities. In addition to DSCA front office leadership and staff, there are six core functional offices aligned under Assistant Directors: the Defense Security Cooperation University, Office of International Operations, Office of Business Operations, Office of Administration, Defense Security Cooperation Service, and the Office of Strategy, Plans, and Policy.
