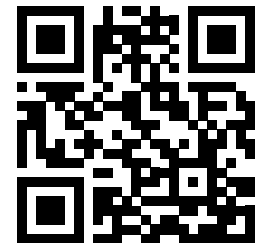

The Department of the Navy (Navy) is continuing work under the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA) Order on Consent EPA Docket No. RCRA-02-2007-7301 to make progress on the investigation and cleanup of existing sites at Naval Activity Puerto Rico (NAPR). The Navy is performing compliance monitoring and other site investigation activities.

There are no planned field activities for May 2026.

IMPORTANT REMINDERS

- To ensure public safety, we encourage you to always follow the safety awareness messages on the signs, do not trespass beyond locked gates, and avoid restricted areas where warning signs are present. These are controlled areas managed by the Navy and the Local Redevelopment Authority.
- For example, Piñeros Island currently under Navy's management is restricted from public use due to the potential presence of munitions on the beach and land areas, as well as the surrounding underwater areas.
- Reminder: The SWMU 79 No Further Action Statement of Basis is available for public review through May 16, 2026, online and at the Ceiba Town Hall, located at 645-655 Calle Escolástico López, Ceiba, Puerto Rico 00735.

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MUNITIONS SAFETY: PRACTICE THE 3Rs – RECOGNIZE, RETREAT, REPORT

When encountered at sea or on land, munitions might explode when moved, disturbed, or handled. Pay attention to all warning signs and locked gates, and stay out of restricted areas.

RECOGNIZE.



Recognize when you may have come across a munition, and that **munitions are dangerous.**

RETREAT.



DO NOT approach, touch, move, or disturb a suspected munition, but carefully leave the area.

At sea, **DO NOT** bring a suspected munition alongside or on board a vessel.

REPORT.



On land, **CALL 911** or **787.885.2020** and tell the authorities what you saw and where you saw it.

At sea, **notify the US Coast Guard (USCG), Channel 16 – 156.800 MHz** or **call the USCG Command Center at 787.289.2041**. Use World Geodetic System 1984 (WGS-84) for reporting.
