SUBJECT: Evaluation of the U.S. Army and Marine Corps' Sustainment of Ashore  
Prepositioned Equipment at Subic Bay, Philippines (Project No. D2026-DEV0PA-  
0095.000)

The purpose of this memorandum is to notify you that the DoW Office of Inspector General is initiating the subject evaluation.\*

The objective of this evaluation is to determine the extent to which the U.S. Army and Marine Corps sustained ashore prepositioned equipment at Subic Bay, Philippines. We may revise the objective as the evaluation proceeds, and we will also consider suggestions from management for additional or revised objectives. We plan to perform this evaluation in accordance with the Council of the Inspectors General on Integrity and Efficiency "Quality Standards for Inspection and Evaluation."

We will perform the evaluation at Fort Shafter, Hawaii; Jacksonville, Florida; and Manila, Philippines. We may identify additional offices and locations during the evaluation.

We request that you designate two points of contact for this evaluation within **5 days** of this memorandum. One point of contact should be a Government employee—a GS-15, pay band equivalent, or military equivalent—who is knowledgeable of oversight and sustainment of ashore prepositioned equipment at Subic Bay. The second point of contact should be a member of the Senior Executive Service or a General/Flag Officer who is familiar with the oversight and sustainment of ashore prepositioned equipment at Subic Bay and could serve as a point of engagement with DoW Office of Inspector General senior leaders, if necessary.
